

# **Hat Fair Carnival 2024**

#### What is Hat Fair?

Hat Fair is an Outdoors Arts festival that takes place every summer across the historic city of Winchester. The festival takes its name from the busking tradition of throwing money into a hat at the end of a performance.

Hat Fair is organised by the arts and education charity Play to the Crowd, which also runs Playmakers and Theatre Royal Winchester.

### What is Hat Fair Carnival?

Hat Fair opens with a burst of riotous colour and costumes as hundreds of children from local schools, and community groups, parade along Winchester's High Street in our Hat Fair Carnival.

### 'Look Back, Look Forward, Look Up!'

Hat Fair returns in summer 2024 and Hat Fair Carnival will take place on Fri 5 July at 1pm. This year we are celebrating Hat Fair's 50th Anniversary with our theme 'Look Back, Look Forward, Look Up!'. We will be 'Looking back' at past Hat Fair artists, 'Looking up' at acrobats and aerial acts and 'Looking forward' to sustainable costumes, robotics and imagination.

We have an amazing opportunity for a limited number of schools and community groups to take part.

We have once again teamed up with The New Carnival Company, a pioneering arts development organisation based on the Isle of Wight specialising in carnival and outdoor public celebrations, to deliver this project.

From February to July 2024 we will be offering sessions alongside The New Carnival Company for teachers, group leaders, and practitioners, covering basic costume-making, backpack creation, and prototyping.

Participants will create costumes specifically for the parade, before participating in Hat Fair Carnival 2024 in July.









### Training, development & taking part

This year Playmakers is offering expert training with The New Carnival Company in the following for teachers and practitioners to take part in:

- Basic Costume Making Skills, Thu 1 Feb 2024, 10am-5pm In person at Theatre Royal Winchester
- Backpacks and Additional Costume Making Workshop, Thu 22 Feb 2024, 10am-5pm
  - In person, venue tbc, Winchester City Centre venue.
- Prototyping your Carnival Costume Thu 21 or Fri 22 March 2024.
  - Each group will be allocated 1x 3-hour session. In person at Theatre Royal Winchester
- Teachers and Community leaders will also receive support throughout the process from Playmakers.

All training is included. We are happy to discuss support with the cost of materials to make costumes. We do not want the cost of materials to be a barrier to you taking part so please do email Hannah (details below) with any questions.

What will participants achieve?

- Participants will have the opportunity to produce costumes and take part in the Hat Fair Carnival 2024.
- Participants will have the opportunity to develop their creativity in the design and making of their costumes.

The sessions for participants (approx. 6-8 hours) can be delivered to fit in with your group's timetable - 1 day sessions, weekly sessions, or after school/group sessions. Whatever works best for you. Please find the full schedule on the final page.

Groups will receive an illustrated guide inspiring costume design, aligned with the theme 'Look Back, Look Forward, Look Up!' Encouraging participants to identify their inspiration, the support extends to crafting bespoke costumes that reflect their choices.
